Foreword by the Chair of SAFAP

I am pleased to introduce this Annual Report on the work of the Treasure Trove Unit (TTU) and the Scottish Archaeological Finds Allocation Panel (SAFAP). Between us, we handle many of the practical aspects of the treasure trove system in the journey from discovery to the final allocation of detected and chance finds, and organised archaeological fieldwork assemblages.

Overall, 2024/25 was a demanding but very positive year for the work of SAFAP and the TTU. The benefits of the time and effort of the past 3 years, particularly in addressing the COVID-19 backlog, have been realised and I am looking forward to exciting developments with the implementation the Treasure Trove Review recommendations.

As expected, detected and chance finds reported to TTU reduced slightly from the post-Covid high of 2023/24 but reporting over the last 5 years is still on an upward trajectory. We expect this to continue as there are new entrants to metal detecting and more sophisticated tools available, as well as greater public awareness.

The Unit staff continue their advice and outreach activities, both remotely and in person, throughout Scotland and the UK. I have joined on a number of occasions and am enormously impressed by the team's interaction with finders and the public at large, a valuable strand of their extensive activity.

In our 3 meetings, SAFAP has considered the usual fascinating range of finds, including the mighty Peebles hoard (full minutes are published on the [Treasure Trove Scotland](#) website). More detail about individual cases is included in this report, together with the value of all Finder Rewards and relevant acquiring museums. SAFAP saw numerous cases with multiple applications, particularly for excavation assemblages. It is worth noting here that the forthcoming publication of new sector standards and guidance for delivery of assemblages to museums may have an impact on the TTU and SAFAP workload.

At the same time, SAFAP and TTU staff spent significant time considering and contributing to the excellent consultation leading to the publication of the wide ranging Review

published in September 2024 and available on both [KLTR](#) and [Treasure Trove Scotland websites](#). I am particularly grateful to SAFAP members for all their additional time and consideration in this regard. SAFAP warmly welcomed the Review overall, and the many detailed recommendations were accepted in full by the KLTR in December 2024. Of those recommendations, some of the most immediately relevant to SAFAP/ TTU are those relating to development of a new Code of Practice with more detailed but accessible information for all users, particularly finders. This will be especially valuable when accompanied by the recommended investment in IT support, including a new TT website, a reporting app and a case management system which will streamline the whole treasure trove process .

A new steering group has been set up to provide a forum for reporting on progress with the implementation of the Review recommendations, which will encourage multi agency action and continued collaboration. As the steering group representative for SAFAP, I look forward to ensuring that this valuable Review is implemented as swiftly as possible.

Introduction

This report covers the work of the Treasure Trove Unit (TTU) and Scottish Archaeological Finds Allocation Panel (SAFAP) from 1 April 2024 – 31 March 2025. For a full list of cases claimed during this period, see **Appendix 1** at the end of this document.

The treasure trove system ensures that archaeological finds recovered in Scotland are publicly recorded, making them available for research, study and general interest. They are a category of “ownerless property” (also known as *bona vacantia*), which the Crown can choose to claim. The Crown, represented by the King’s and Lord Treasurer’s Remembrancer (KLTR) in Scotland, claims significant archaeological finds on behalf of the public so that they can be preserved in museum collections across Scotland. It is through the treasure trove system that museums have opportunities to apply for claimed archaeological finds so that they can collect significant finds for preservation in public collections for everyone’s benefit. The KLTR can also disclaim finds, which are then returned to the finder to deal with as they wish.

SAFAP is an independent panel which advises the KLTR on valuations and allocations of archaeological finds claimed by the Crown. It meets at least three times a year to consider claims brought forward by the TTU.

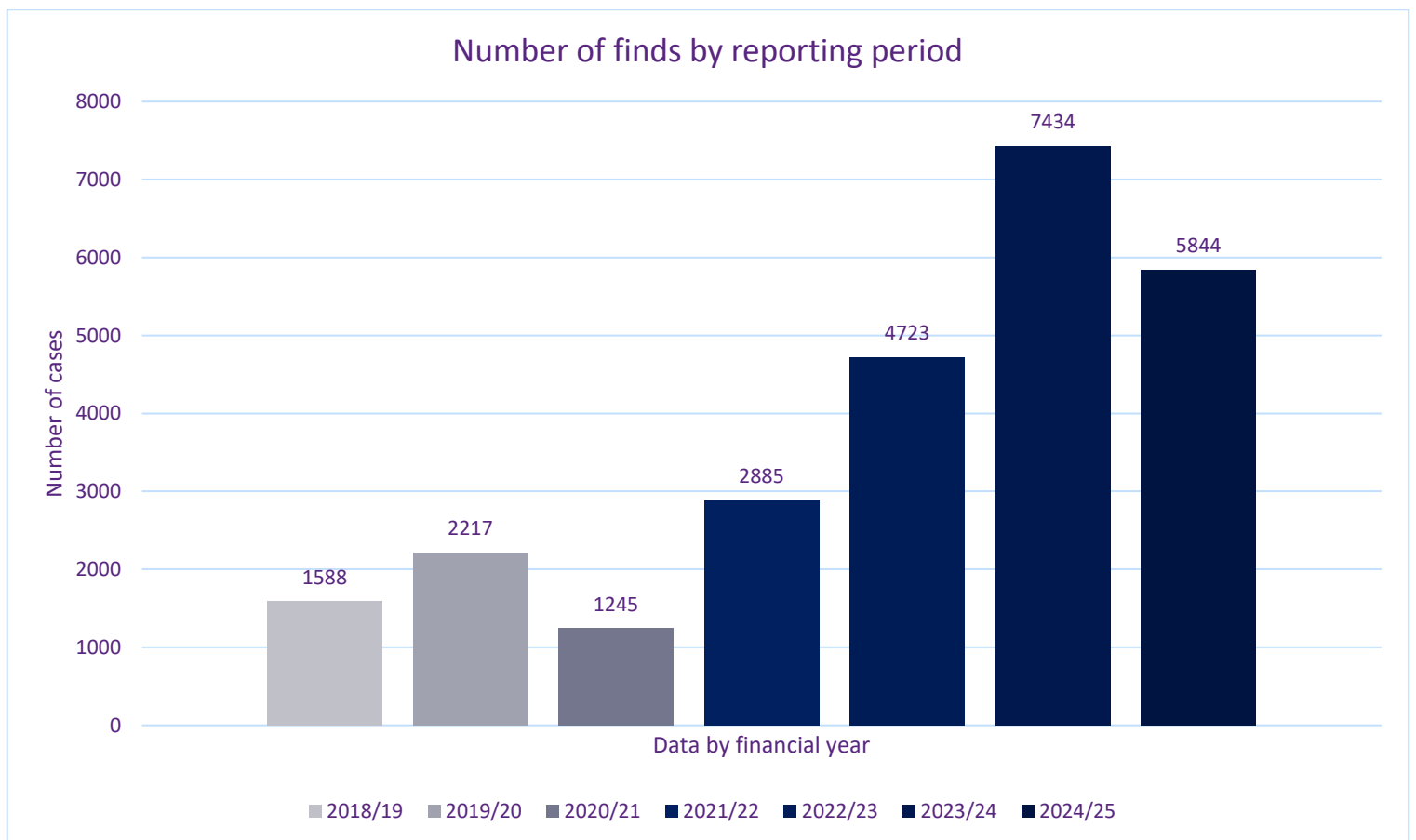

Statistics

The following statistics are categorised into “reported finds” and “recorded finds”. “Reported finds” refer to the number of finds submitted to the TTU. “Recorded finds” indicate the number of finds that the TTU processed, added to the treasure trove case management system, and either disclaimed or identified them as future claims. The finds “recorded” in FY 24/25 were submitted to the TTU in previous years and therefore do not correspond to the number of “reported finds” in this report.

Reported Finds

From 1 April 2024 to 31 March 2025, 5,844 chance finds were reported and handed in to TTU staff. Whilst this number is a decrease from FY 23/24, it is still an upward trend. There were 87 excavation assemblages reported.



Graph: number of artefacts handed in by finders to the TTU during the reporting period specified. This only includes finds held by the TTU and does not include remotely recorded finds or excavation assemblages. Note: the 2022/23 figure does not include a hoard of c. 7000 coins so as not to skew the graph.

Metal detectorists represent the majority of finders and the number of finds recovered by each individual is unpredictable.

A number of factors may explain this decrease in the number of finds handed in:

- The previous year saw finders reporting more finds due to being unable to during the Covid-19 pandemic.
- Pressure on TTU staffing over this period, which reduced the ability to conduct outreach events (programme detailed below).
- An increase in remote recording/triaging, which were not tallied during this reporting period.

Recorded finds

From 1 April 2024 to 31 March 2025, 6,020 finds were recorded on the TTU case management system: 4,669 finds were recorded by the TTU at NMS, 463 finds were recorded remotely (where the finds did not come into the TTU office) and 888 finds were processed by a freelance specialist over 12 days.

Outreach

Outreach events held in museums across Scotland continue to form an important part of the TTU's work and each event is a valuable opportunity to meet with finders and museum staff directly, as well as members of the public. The TTU has an annual programme of events, and the FY 24/25 programme is detailed in the table below:

Note: Those events with n/a against “appointments” and “no. finds taken in by TTU” indicate that this was not a finder focused event but rather engaging with museum staff or a wider public event to increase treasure trove visibility.

Total appointments: 143 finders met; 2,661 finds taken in.

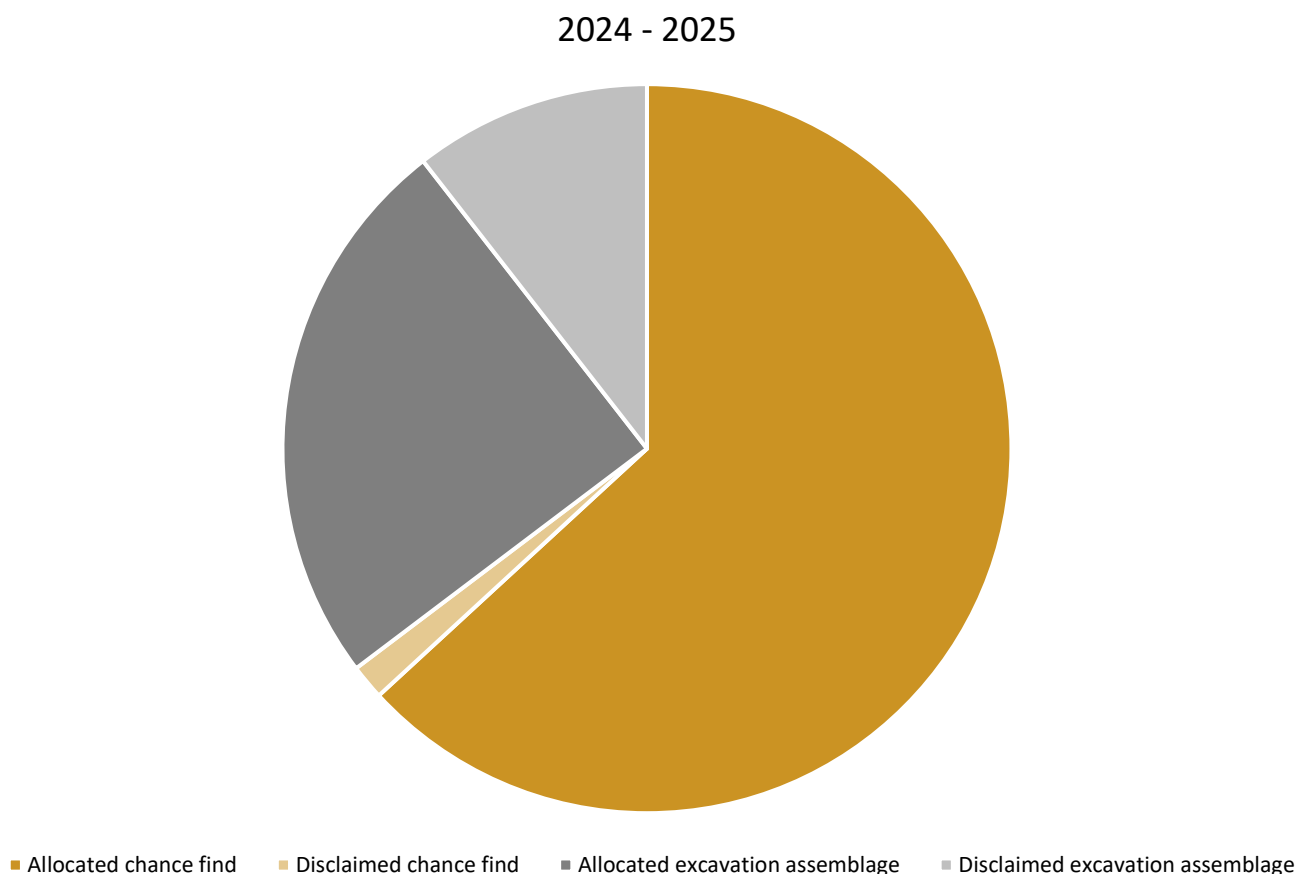
These events have a positive impact on TTU visibility and ensuring that the team are as accessible as possible for finders to report finds. Outreach events will continue to be prioritised to encourage further reporting and enhance TTU’s reputation across Scotland.

Transferring finds

A total of 7 museums were visited in addition to the above outreach events. These trips comprised of couriering allocated cases, disclaimed finds for return to the finders and receiving new finds from the museums.

Allocated finds

In this reporting period, the panel held its three meetings in May, August and December 2024. In total, SAFAP reviewed and discussed 209 cases of chance finds made by members of the public (representing 2,049 individual finds); 5 of these cases were disclaimed at panel to be returned to finders (representing 40 individual finds).



Graph: number of chance finds and excavation assemblage cases allocated and disclaimed at SAFAP for 2024/25.

Finders of claimed archaeological finds are usually offered Finder Rewards (which are funded by the acquiring museum). Rewards are made by the KLTR, taking into account advice from SAFAP with evidence, where possible, linked to the market value of the finds. In this reporting period the total sum paid to members of the public was £138,651, compared to £84,533 the previous year. A full breakdown of rewards can be found in **Appendix 1** and most individual payments were under £1000.

Individual coins can account for larger valuations, although the Peebles Hoard, valued at £80,000 (acquired by NMS) is responsible for the significant increase in the overall sum

paid to finders last year. Some museums secured funding through the National fund for Acquisitions and through public fundraising programmes. In 4 cases the finders waived or part-waived their finder rewards to support museums in acquiring the finds.

In the same period, SAFAP considered 124 excavation assemblages. Of these, 34 were returned to the excavator as no museum wished to acquire them due to the cases containing finds of little archaeological value.

No finder rewards were paid for the 90 allocated assemblages, as the material was recovered through organised fieldwork.

Appendix 1 lists the archaeological finds claimed as Treasure Trove, with information on the findspots and where the cases were allocated.

Talks, lectures, and media

Excavations

Three excavations to follow up interesting discoveries were undertaken in partnership with National Museums Scotland. Due to the excellent work of the metal detectorists and their prompt action in contacting the Unit, the excavations were able to record important archaeological context which will support the interpretation of all of the finds.

- **Cappercleuch Medieval coin hoard, Scottish Borders:** a hoard of 30 Medieval Scottish gold and English silver coins deposited in the 1460s, discovered by metal detectorists and subject to a follow-up 3-day excavation by TTU and NMS. The hoard received press coverage, including pieces in The Scotsman and the Daily Telegraph.
- **Black Isle Medieval coin hoard, Highland:** a scatter of 11 fragmentary groats of Robert II was found by a metal detectorist, who reported a large signal still in situ. A

team from TTU and NMS went to excavate the site across 3 days, but no further coins were found.

- **Whittingehame modern iron ring, East Lothian:** a large metal object was discovered by a metal detectorist but left in situ. Believed to possibly be a Medieval cauldron, a team from TTU and NMS conducted a 1-day excavation, aided by a digger provided by the landowner. Unfortunately, the find was modern iron.

TTU staffing

The 2024 Treasure Trove Review recommendations were agreed by the KLTR in September 2024 with the final report published in December. Following this, implementation of the recommendations began, and staff were seconded to undertake this work from January 2025 for an initial duration of 6 months. The Treasure Trove Manager was seconded to the KLTR Office to work with the Chair of the Treasure Trove Review to revise the Treasure Trove Code of Practice. The KLTR's Head of Treasure Trove Policy and Treasure Trove Policy Advisor were seconded to National Museums Scotland to work on recommendations pertaining to policy development and procurement. A Treasure Trove Officer became acting TTU Manager. This actively positions the TTU and KLTR Office for a stronger collaborative working relationship going forward.

Funding

The treasure trove system is funded by the KLTR and the Scottish Government through grant-in-aid to NMS, which covers operational costs of the TTU and SAFAP. More information on funding will be published in the KLTR's Annual Report and Accounts.

Objectives

Last year's Annual Report set out broad objectives for the Unit. As the narrative shows, these have been addressed in 2024/25 despite the various staffing changes and absences.

It remains the TTU/SAFAP stated ambition to reduce turnaround time from **reporting** to **conclusion** of the process to within 12 to 18 months, acknowledging that there will be extraordinary cases that will take longer. In future, specific TTU targets will be incorporated in formal Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) set by the KLTR and will form part of the reporting in the KLTR Annual Report and Accounts.

Interesting cases

Prehistoric and Roman finds



TT 254/23, allocated to Stranraer Museum

A high-relief mask of the Gorgon Medusa. Her hair is depicted as wavy bands which project upwards from her forehead and sideways from her temples. Two snakes emerge from her hair, one on each side, which coil tightly around to have their heads resting on her temples between the bands of hair. c. 1st century BCE - 1st century CE



TT 82/24, allocated to National Museums Scotland

An assemblage of three Roman Iron Age finds, dating to c. 1st - 3rd century CE. This includes an enamelled brooch, enamelled pommel and a denarius of Lucius Verus.



TT 189/24, allocated to ANGUSalve

Late Bronze Age copper-alloy axehead. C. 1150 - 800 BCE



TT 199/24, allocated to ANGUSalve

Late Bronze Age copper-alloy tanged-and-collared chisel. C. 1150 - 800 BCE



TT 223/23, allocated to National Museums Scotland

A hoard of Late Bronze Age mounts, fittings and a sword dating to c. 1000 - 800 BCE



TT 30/24, allocated to Elgin Museum

A hoard of Late Bronze Age artefacts dating to c. 1100 to 800 BCE. The ring-mounts have evidence of a tin-enriched surface. This could be intentional enriching through the casting process or could be due to the conditions in which the objects were buried, bringing the tin to the surface.

Early Medieval and Medieval finds



TT 133/24, allocated to Fife Cultural Trust

Solid silver figurine of the Madonna and Child. The figure is seated on a scroll-armed throne with the Christ-child sat on her lap and held with her left arm. C. 1200 - 1400 CE.



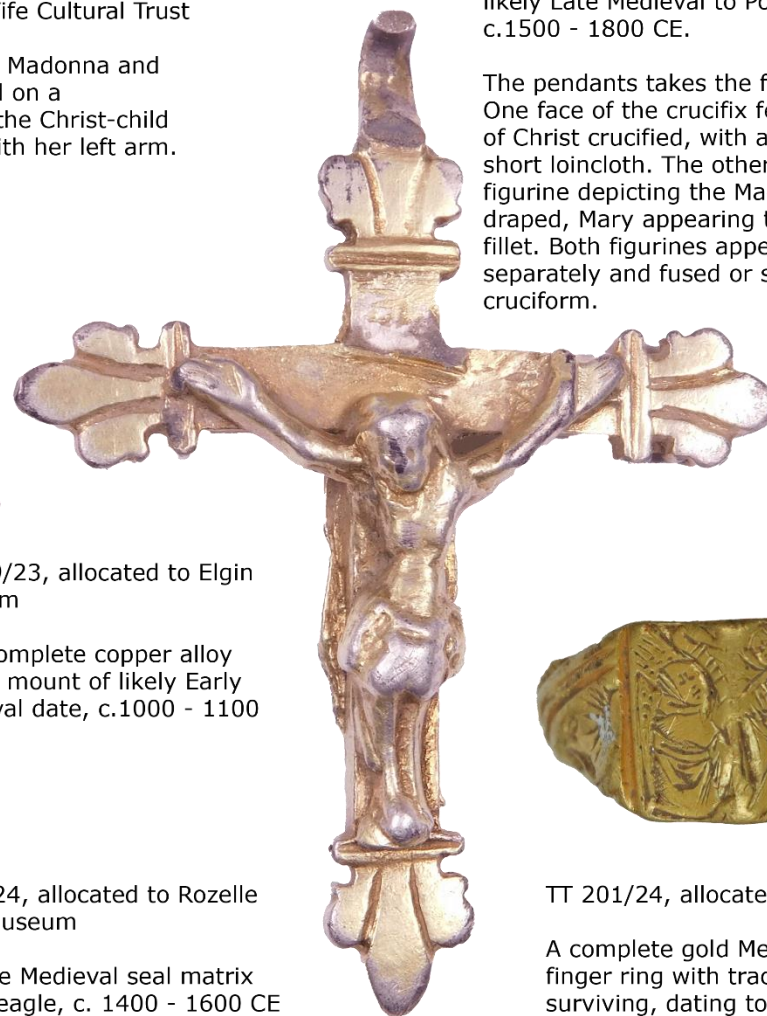
TT 289/23, allocated to Elgin Museum

An incomplete copper alloy stirrup mount of likely Early Medieval date, c.1000 - 1100 CE.



TT 182/24, allocated to Rozelle House Museum

Complete Medieval seal matrix with an eagle, c. 1400 - 1600 CE



TT 13/24, allocated to Perth Museum and Art Gallery

An incomplete silver gilt pendant crucifix of likely Late Medieval to Post Medieval date, c.1500 - 1800 CE.

The pendant takes the form of a Latin cross. One face of the crucifix features a cast figurine of Christ crucified, with arms raised and a short loincloth. The other face features a figurine depicting the Madonna and child, both draped, Mary appearing to wear a crown or fillet. Both figurines appear to have been cast separately and fused or soldered to the cruciform.



TT 201/24, allocated to ANGUSalve

A complete gold Medieval iconographic finger ring with traces of white enamel surviving, dating to c. 1450 - 1550 CE.

Post-medieval to modern finds



TT 261/23, allocated to North Ayrshire Museums Service

A lead-alloy forgers mould for a Charles III of Spain 8-real coin, 1759 - 1816 CE.



TT 317/23, allocated to Inverness Museum and Art Gallery

An incomplete silver heart-shaped brooch of likely Post-Medieval or Modern date, c. 1700 - 1900 CE.



TT 209/24, allocated to Museum of Islay Life
A complete silver annular brooch of likely Post Medieval date, c.1600 - 1800CE.

Once face features two sets of two wyverns, joined by their intertwined tails. The opposite face features an abstract pattern of four thistles, with the head of each thistle entwined with the beginning of the next thistle.



TT 310/23, allocated to Aberdeenshire Museums Service

Complete gold finger ring with inlaid enamel decoration and set with a rectangular table cut garnet or red rock crystal. C. 1600 - 1700 CE



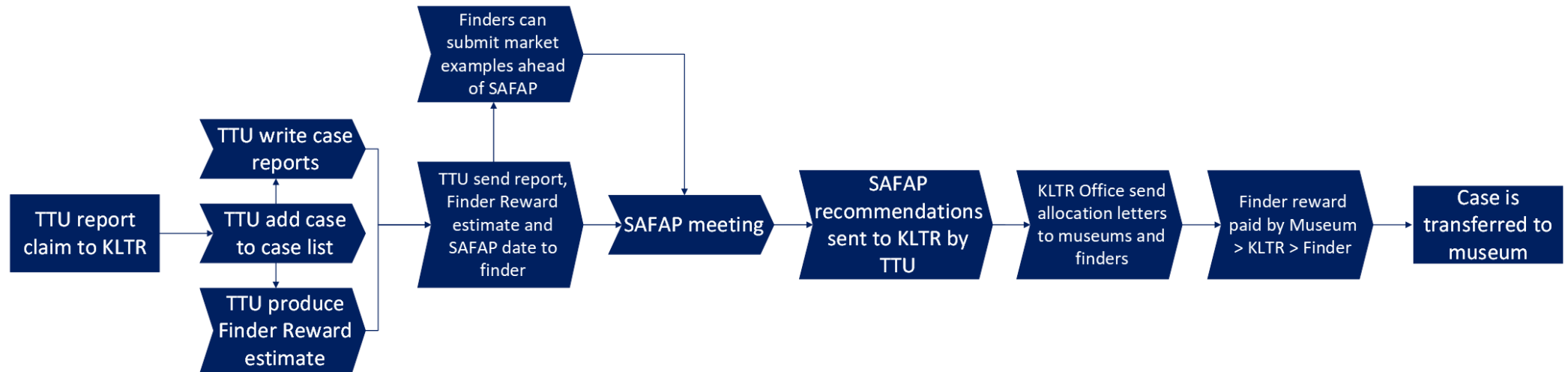
TT 12/24, allocated to Fife Cultural Trust

A complete set of copper alloy cup weights of likely Late Medieval to Post Medieval date, c. 1500 - 1800 CE. The whole consists of a case and five weights.

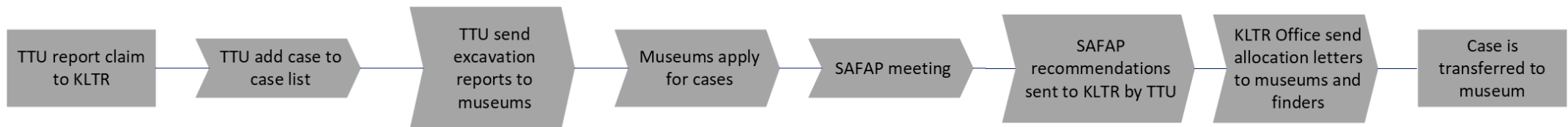

Appendix 1: Allocations of Treasure Trove Cases

Where a case is marked as ‘Disclaimed’ it did not attract any applications from museums and was returned to the finder. Cases marked as “Deferred” were discussed at Panel but could not be allocated.

Where a case is marked by * against the name of the museum, this indicates that the objects were acquired by that museum in a second round of applications, in the absence of any applications from local museums.

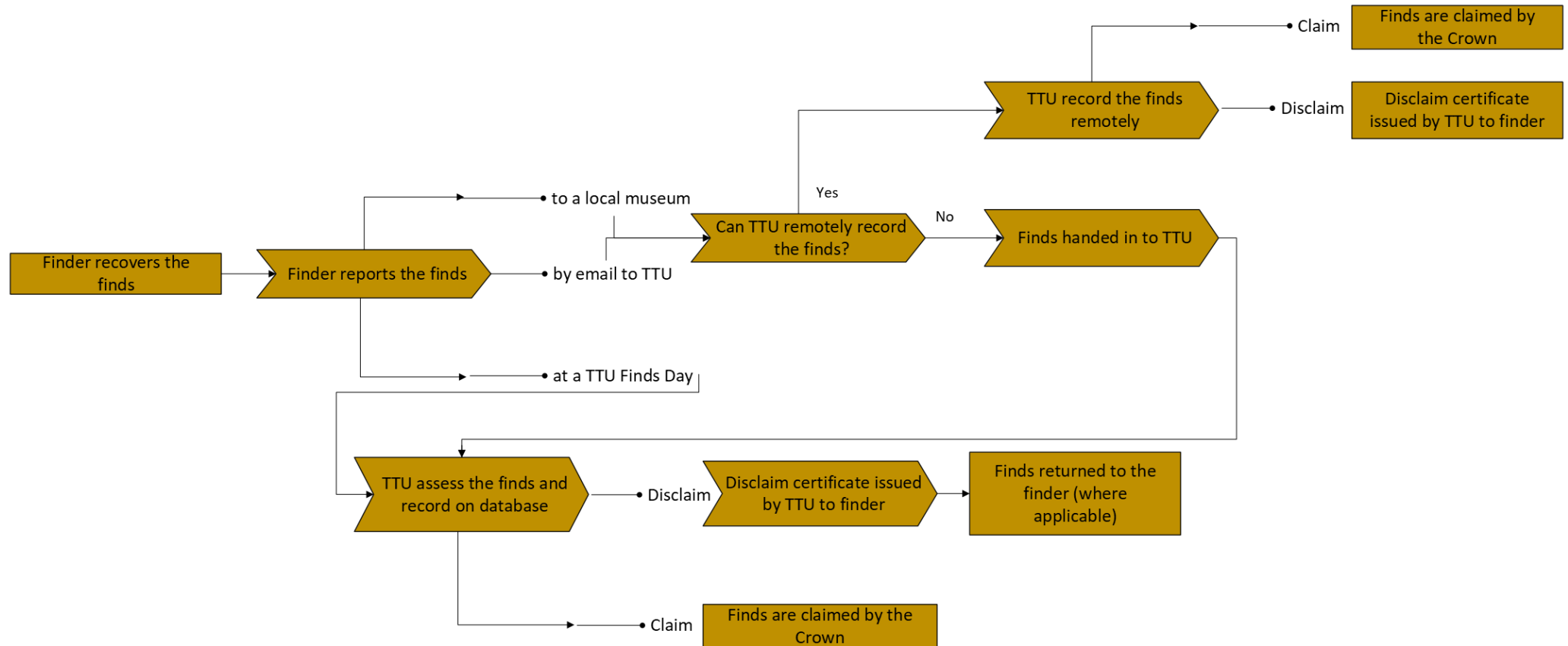

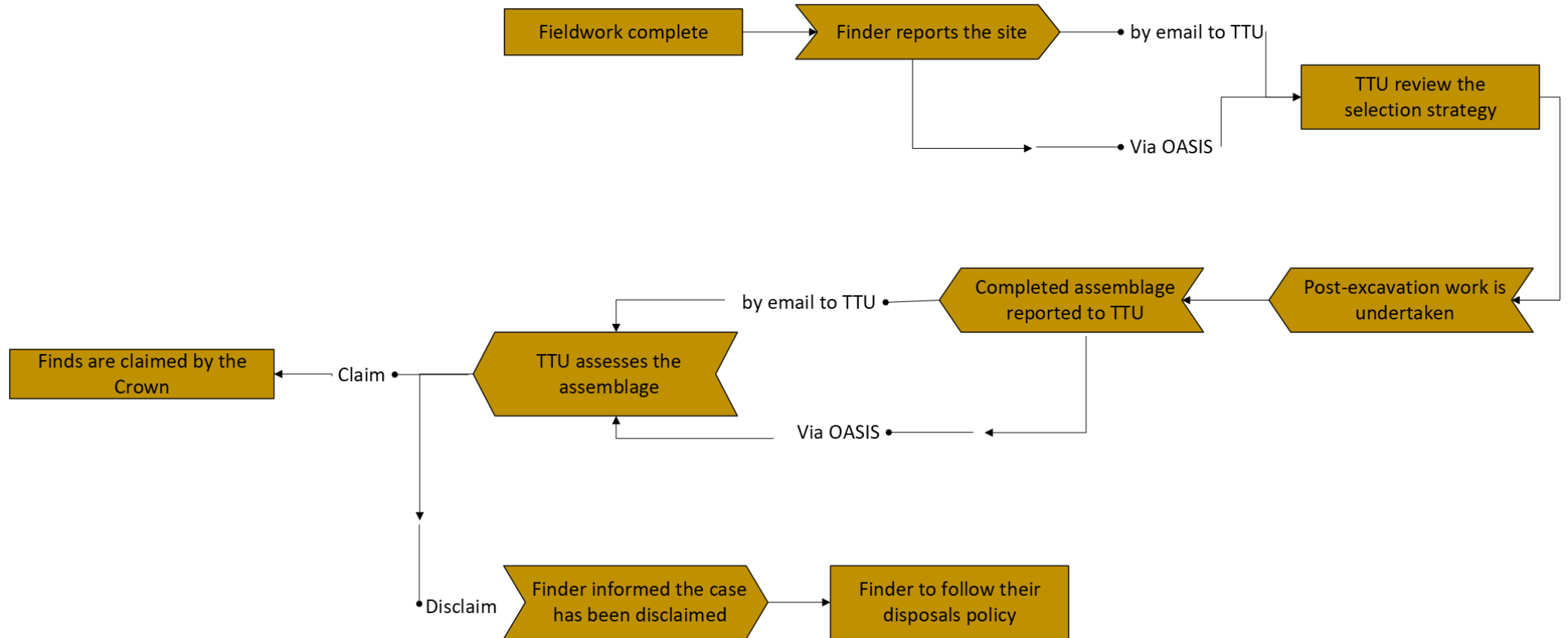
