1. Minutes of the last meeting and action plan

Most actions still on hold, pending review.

FH asked about progress with the complaints procedure (discussed at the August 2024 meeting) and it was confirmed that this is on hold pending further review. The KLTR complaints procedure is live.

2. Chair news and current issues

JR noted that PY has resigned from the Panel with immediate effect. Chair thanked him for his contribution to SAFAP, the work of the TTU, and the improvements she has seen since joining the panel.

3. TTU report

SW joined the meeting online during this section

EF informed the panel that she will be going on secondment to the KLTR office for a minimum of 6 months from 6th January. MD and SK will be joining NMS to work with TTU. EF will send around a digital version of the draft timetable for implementation, which gives further information about the work for the next 3 years.

EF noted that two staff members are currently working reduced hours. Chair asked how it has impacted the unit's work. EF explained that a full team would likely be on target to process the number of finds that were handed in during 2024 but noted that the team is not starting from zero.

Chair asked about the development of a policy for the backlog of historic finds not able to be returned to finders. EF advised that the unit are chasing finders with at least three emails before sending letters, but the policy is not currently in writing. FH mentioned that NMS has procedures in place to track unknown lenders, and TTU might draw on this. MD said that this will be looked at in more detail in the Code of Practice disposal procedures.

EF summarised the outreach undertaken by TTU since the August 2024 meeting. EF advised that the TT team will start to record numbers of finds being handed back to finders over the next 12 months. Chair asked to note in minutes all of these outreach events have taken place.

EF reported the recent excavation undertaken in the Scottish Borders, supported by NMS archaeologists.

EF explained the current finds processing graph and FH noted that it is good that finds numbers are coming down. Chair asked about triaging and 'on the spot' disclaiming during outreach, which AL explained is what the team aims to do with finders, but it is not always possible due to time pressures on the day. Remote recording figures are not on the graph but EF has a current list. BS asked if finders are saving up their finds for finds days, EF explained that they do, mainly due to their location, the cost of sending objects to TTU via post etc. Chair observed that the partner museum recommendation could have a significant impact on triaging finds.

Action: Disposals policy to be agreed so the backlog can be resolved by March 2026

Action: EF to add outreach events to minutes in future

4. NMS and other updates

FH summarised the NMS role in the upcoming implementation of the TT review recommendations: BJ to take over line management of TTU, and she extended thanks to FH for his line management of the unit.

One of the Post-Excavation Officers will be working with TTU for one day a week, January to March, to help with the TTU workload.

The Peebles hoard fundraising is going well, with about 25% of the target already raised.

The *Before the Museum* project final report is to be completed in February or March, with the aim to implement from April 2025.

BS reported that HES are working with NMS on the human remains strategy, and that the new HES Chief Executive has started.

For MGS, JO'S is keen to further develop collections dispersal/disposal methods across the sector and reported the relaunch of the Recognition Scheme in 2025 after review.

5. AOCB

- Treasure Trove Review update

MD summarised the draft implementation plan, which covers roughly the next 3 years. MD thanked SAFAP for their formal response to the recommendations. JR, as Chair of SAFAP, will be a member of the steering group implementing the recommendations. The first year of the plan is anticipated to be busier and will focus on TTU's future working patterns within NMS.

There will be an opportunity to evaluate the work of the TT Review at the end of 2027 (e.g. TTU and KLTR staffing).

MD and SK's work at NMS will mostly involve the shape of the TTU, CMS and website work, and EF will work on sections of Code of Practice and partnership museums. Chair asked where funding for the partner museums is coming from, MD says at they have some ideas, but more discussion is needed with stakeholders. SW asked about how partner museums are chosen, MD says work is still ongoing, but some talks have already taken place with museums where TTU already work in partnership.

Panel members confirmed they were ready to feed into these implementation projects before the 30th April SAFAP and annual review meeting.

Break for lunch at 12:00, BJ left the meeting.

Caselist

Chair asked if there had been any progress on the deferred Bronze Age axehead (TT 85/24); SW reported that Campbeltown Museum has just been granted Accreditation but there are still operational issues that need to be resolved before being able to apply for TT cases. Panel agreed to defer the case until the next meeting.

TT 126/24; TT 184/24: Panel discussed the conflicting applications and supporting statements from the University of Aberdeen and Aberdeenshire Museums Service. The panel determined that Aberdeenshire Museums Service provided a stronger argument for acquiring case TT 126/24, as the emphasis was on display and filling gaps in the collection, but the University of Aberdeen's application for TT 184/24 was stronger due to the emphasis on research for the dirham fragment. Panel agreed to recommend allocation of **TT 126/24** to Aberdeenshire Museums Service and **TT 184/24** to the University of Aberdeen.

TT 201/24: Panel discussed the external valuation and noted that after costs and fees to be applied by the auction house, the amount the finder received might may be broadly similar to the ex-gratia valuation. Panel agreed that the original valuation was reasonable and should not be changed.

FH left room for discussion of NMS cases.

TT 192/24: The lack of a detailed findspot given by the finder was noted and warranted a decrease in valuation. Panel agree to a reduction from £1,400 to new valuation of £1,200.

TT 119/24: It was noted that the finder did not have landowner permission and the Panel recommended a reduction from £455 to £230. Panel recommended that better guidance for landowners should be added to the Code of Practice.

TT 121/24 and **TT 132/24:** The recommended valuation for both cases was queried as being too high, and Panel agreed reductions of £20 in both cases; for **TT 121/24** from £40 to £20, and for **TT 132/24** from £100 to £80.

TT 139/24: EF reported that Paisley Museum stated that currently it takes at least six months for new acquisitions to be approved by their collections committee, which effectively precludes acquisition. Panel agreed to give the museum extra time to apply for the cases on this caselist but the Chair will send a letter to Paisley Museum which it is hoped will prompt the museum to review this policy internally.

Action: Chair to write to Paisley Museum.
